Players will start with 12,000 in tournament chips. Players will start with 12,000 in tournament chips.

- Administrative fee includes any and all staffing/dealer fees, and rake.
- Registration will remain open until the start of level 7, eliminated players may re-enter until this time. All original fees apply.
 Players must have zero chips remaining to re-enter. Players may forfeit or surrender their chips to re-enter.
- Any player who has not taken a hand by start of the first break may be considered a "no show" and may have their chips removed from
 play and may not be eligible to participate and may not be eligible for a refund.
- There will be a 10-minute break after approximately every two hours of play. Scheduled as a one-day tournament.
- If scheduled as a "Bounty" the players are required to have their bounty chip on the table at all times. Bounties are awarded to the winner of the pot in which a player is eliminated from the tournament.
- The Tournament Director in his sole and absolute discretion may adjust the break schedule, adjust the start and stop time, adjust the level lengths, and/or add an additional day if necessary.
